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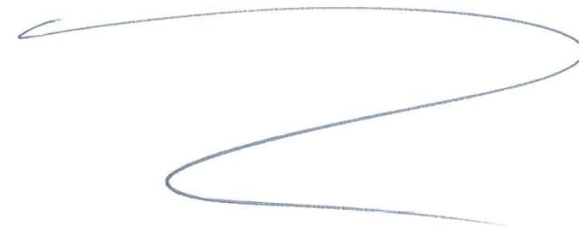

Lessons learned - data collection

- Collecting data for patients with metastatic or recurrent breast cancer is mandatory (has been since 2009)
- Data for patients with metastases or recurrence should be submitted through NCWTMDS even if they are not having treatment or surgery

Lessons learned – the MDT

- 13/15 pilots sites said they discussed recurrent/metastatic patients at their breast MDT
- New model - dedicated metastatic MDM
- Dedicated session at current MDT

Lessons learned - Supportive Care

- 43% of patients entered in the pilot were not referred to any type of supportive care
- Every patient with metastatic breast cancer should have the support of a CNS who has the skills and knowledge to manage their care appropriately

What next?

- WMCIU and NCIN will review the data regularly
- From Jan 2013 data on supportive care will be collected through COSD
- Data will inform Breast Cancer Cares services and campaigns
