Background

- Commissioned by NHS London through a tendering process
- Initiated and supervised by Geraldine Strathdee
- Project managed by Mazars
- Started July 2012 completed March 2013

Why was it commissioned?

- Bring together a wide range of information across the mental health pathway
- Support joint strategic needs assessment, strategy development, and commissioning decisions
- Help to improve data quality
- More interactive than previous indicator work
- Described as a 'prototype' for possible future development

Who are the tools for?

- Health and Wellbeing Boards (to support JSNA and strategy development)
- Commissioners (CCGs, local authorities, NHS England)
- National Bodies (eg Public Health England, NTA)
- Providers
- Service user organisations


Four tools

- Severe mental illness (132 indicators)
- Common mental health disorders (114 indicators)
- Children and young people's mental health and wellbeing (95 indicators)
- Substance misuse (95 indicators)
- Also produced a 'Key findings' report for each tool

Extensive consultation

- Expert Reference Group for each tool
- King's Fund workshop
- Individual meetings, eg:
 - Commissioners
 - GPs and shadow CCG leads
 - Clinicians
 - Public health
 - Data and finance experts
 - Other specialists

Overall layout of the tool



Data content

- Inclusion criteria, eg:
 - relevance
 - nationally available
 - borough-level
 - reasonable continuity
 - data quality
- Wide coverage across the pathway, eg:
 - population 'determinants' / prevention
 - primary care
 - social care
 - specialist care

Key features

- A dashboard to select key indicators
- Can choose different types of chart
- Choice of comparator boroughs (eg NHS England local areas, deprivation groups, boroughs served by each MH Trust, groups that users can define themselves)
- London and England averages
- Confidence intervals
- Ability to download data
- Notes on each indicator
- Guidance notes on the tool

Some issues

- Well-received in consultation, but need 'real-life' feedback from tool users
- Carried out at a time of great change in the NHS and local government
- Data availability (but there is more info than many people think!)
- New and improving mental health data (eg PbR)
- Data quality in some areas
- Updating and extending coverage?
- Using data to influence decisions....
