

Cancer data flows

CancerOutcomes and Services Dataset (COSD) specification for standardised, mandatory and optional data fields

Direct feeds:

- Patient Administration Systems
- Data from MDTs
- Pathology full-text reports
- Imaging Systems

Indirect feeds:

- Cancer Waiting Times
- Chemotherapy dataset
- Radiotherapy dataset
