I trained at Gonville & Caius College, Cambridge University and the London Hospital Medical College, qualifying in 1987. My surgical training started in South London, working at Kings College Hospital before moving to Sidcup and Tunbridge Wells. At the Royal London, working in Professor NS William's department, I performed research into the role of colonic bacteria in maintaining a healthy colon. For this work I was awarded a Hunterian Professorship.

Further surgical training continued on the Nottingham rotation working with Professors' Hardcastle & Scholefield, before being appointed a Consultant at Good Hope in 1998.

My clinical practice is based on disorders of the large bowel. I have a special interest in pelvic surgery, both for patients suffering with cancer and those with functional bowel disorders.

I was Lead Cancer Clinician for Good Hope Hospital until 2004 and continue as the Lead Colorectal Clinician. Currently, I chair the Trust's Local Negotiating Committee. I regularly teach students and lecture at national conferences / courses.

Since 2003 I have been a member of the Royal College of Surgeons Patient Liaison Group & have recently been appointed to the Court of Examiners.
